

**Place and Time:** *Catherine, Called Birdy* takes place in England during the year 1290. Birdy celebrates her 14th birthday on September 19, 1290. Her father, Rollo, is a "country knight." They have 10 servants, 70 villagers, and 2 small manors. One of those manors is Stonebridge in Lincolnshire. It is a fictional manor, but Lincolnshire is a county in England, within the United Kingdom.

The King of England in 1290 was Edward I, also called Edward Longshanks. He was married to Eleanor of Castile from 1254 to 1290, when she died.
